## Directions to New Energy Events:

### **Green Building Tour/Lenox Hotel, 710 Boylston Street:**

The Green Building Bus Tour will depart from the Lenox Hotel. Boarding begins at 1:15 p.m. and the buses will depart at 1:30 p.m. sharp.

By Public Transportation (MBTA): Take the Green Line to the Copley stop. Upon exiting the station turn right onto Boylston Street and proceed past the Public Library to Exeter Street. The Lenox is located on the corner of Boylston and Exeter Streets.

### **Wind & Waves/Central Wharf:**

The Boat tour will depart from Central Wharf directly adjacent to the New England Aquarium at a slip immediately to its left. Boarding begins at 1:00 p.m. and the boat will depart at 1:30 p.m. sharp. Located on Atlantic Avenue near the end of State Street, the Aquarium is an easy walk from Faneuil Hall or Government Center. Walk east towards the Harbor through Faneuil Hall and Quincy Market and then diagonally to the right across the Central Artery ("Big Dig") passing the Long Wharf Marriott to the Aquarium. By public transportation (MBTA), take the Blue Line to the Aquarium stop which emerges within view of the Aquarium. New England Aquarium telephone: 617-973-5200

### **New Energy for America Event/State Room, 60 State Street:**

The State Room, with panoramic views of Boston, is located on the 33<sup>rd</sup> floor of 60 State Street at the corner of State and Congress Streets.

By public transportation (MBTA):

- Take the Green Line to the Government Center stop. Walk down State Street about two blocks and the State Room will be on your left.
- or take the Red Line to the Downtown Crossing stop and walk down Washington Street to State Street. Turn right onto State Street and look for the State Room on the left.
- or take the Orange Line to the State Street stop and walk down State Street to the State Room.
